

Normal Vision



20/20


- Visual Acuity
- Visual Field
- Eye Examination

Visually Impaired



- 20/70
- Sight not corrected with regular glasses or contacts

Legal Blindness



- 20/200
- With Best Correction
- Field of less than
 20 degrees.



Low Vision Types

- Loss of central vision
- Loss of peripheral (side) vision
- Night blindness
- Blurred vision
- Hazy or Fuzzy vision

Causes of Vision Loss

- Glaucoma
- Retinitis Pigmentosa
- Diabetes

Glaucoma

- Fluid in the eye does not drain properly
- Increase pressure on the Optic Nerve
- No symptoms
- Second leading cause of blindness in the world
- Accounts for 9-12% of blindness in the United States

Retinitis Pigmentosa

- Damage to the Retina
- Begins in childhood, lifelong
- Decrease night vision or in low light areas
- Loss of side vision (tunnel vision)

Diabetes

- Blood sugar is too high
- Can lead to blindness, kidney failure, nerve damage, heart disease and strokes.
- More than 29 million case in America

Stereotypes & Misconceptions

- All Blind or Visually Impaired person live in total darkness.
- All Blind people read Braille.
- We can recognize currency by touch.
- Are musically gifted


